Interview with the Student Union Chairperson, Samuel Hung



Q1: What got you interested in becoming Chairperson of the Student Union?

A1: When I was in Form One, one of the proposed SU cabinets at that time--Credit--took time out of their busy week to teach us how to do homework in a thorough and systematic way. They taught us their secret study skills ! They came to our classroom and showed us how to stay organized. It was very kind of them. I was surprised that they were willing to spend time with us even though they were very busy with their schoolwork.

Ultimately, I was inspired by the enthusiasm of Credit and I decided that I wanted to be just like them ! I knew that I wanted to reach out and find a way to help all the students in our school. Additionally, I wanted to acquire the leadership skills that would allow me to lead well, guiding my classmates and helping my team accomplish something good for the whole school.

Therefore, I chose to lead my Cabinet members through a grueling Student Union election this past September. In the election, we were able to learn a lot of new skills, such as public relations, app development, and thinking from the perspective of a social worker. We were able to accomplish some tangible benefits for our schoolmates.

Q2: What is the most important quality that one needs in order to be the Chairperson of the SU?

A2: Certainly, the answer to this question must be 'leadership' ! But what do I mean by that ? It sounds like such a cliché, even though it's the most essential quality for being a great leader.

Leadership means a combination of organizational skills, vision, and motivational ability. As a Chairperson of the Student Union, I have to organize three different platforms simultaneously.

These platforms were designed by SU members to promote to student well-being at Kei Yuen. It's not an easy job and, overall, it can be quite stressful. Furthermore, as the Chairperson, I must stand strong behind each Cabinet Member, especially when we face criticism. After all, we occupy a public position in the school. I always encourage my members to stay tough and stay strong when they are under the microscope.

A chairperson also needs to have good skills in diplomacy, responding well to questions, queries and complaints from students. I call this set of skills 'leadership qualities' and with leadership, I can unite the SU and run an efficient and effective Student Union.

Q3: Do you have any long-term goals for your team?

A3: We, as a team, always aim to serve each student. We try our very best for Kei Yuen College, and we do this wholeheartedly. Over the long-term, we are looking to further develop our service toward S.1 students. It's an android app called 'Mobile SU', and it is a platform where students can solve any problems related to their school work and generally communicate with SU members.

Our Mobile SU app is increasing in importance the longer the pandemic continues. The test app that we have now has been welcomed by many S.1 students.

As we all know, under the COVID-19 pandemic, many Form One students did not have a chance to meet one another during summer orientation. This is in contrast to previous years. Obviously, this scenario is not desirable and could eventually prevent students from fully adapting to secondary school life. So, the Mobile SU serves as a good starting point for us to interact with incoming S.1 students. Through the experiences of creating a mobile app that serves the needs of students, we will be able to achieve our overall goals for 2020-2021.

Another initiative that we are trying to develop is Student Health and Welfare, which means serving the food and clothing needs of students specifically. For example, we have invited students to shop for low-cost sportswear, toiletries, and uniform-related products on our Instagram shop. Students were able to participate in special offers and discounts via the online platform. We feel that we have fulfilled the most urgent needs of the majority of our schoolmates. The Student Union will continue to strive to serve our classmates in a variety of ways for the rest of the school year.

Fun Science Experiments!



Our school's annual Creative Fun Day was held on the 7th of November. I was delighted to be one of the helpers who was responsible for doing science experiments with the primary school students. It was an unforgettable experience to work alongside them in the Chemistry Laboratory.

Another experiment that left a deep impression on me was the carbon rocket. By mixing chalk and vinegar, we could make a small 'rocket' inside the laboratory. When

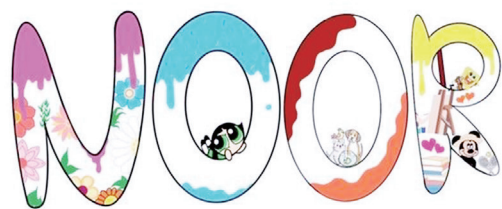

Music Contest Champion 2020

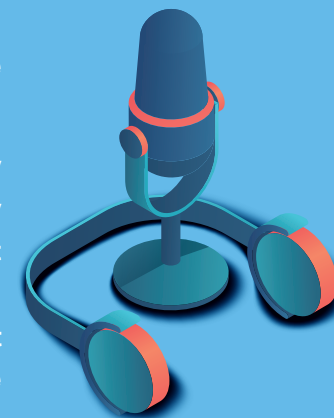

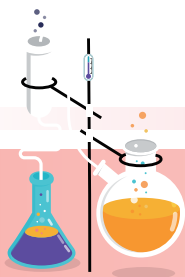

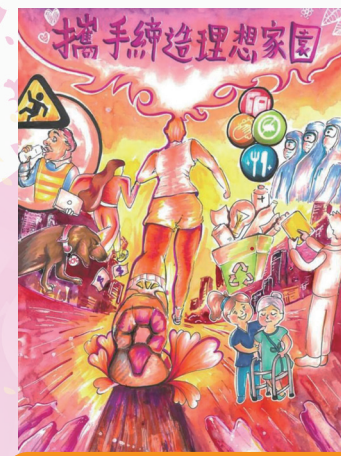
