I am so proud to win this prize and wish to express my thanks to the Grantham Scholarship Funds Committee.

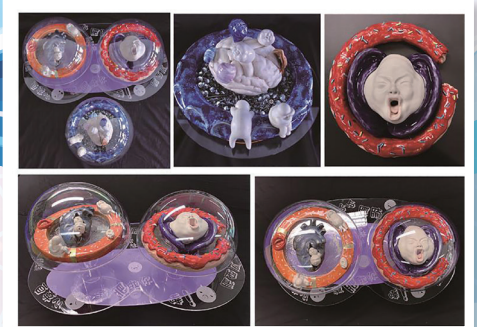

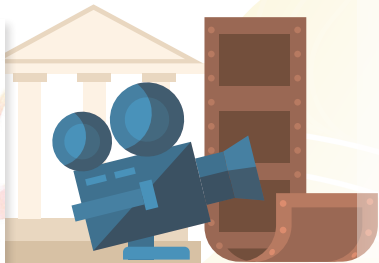

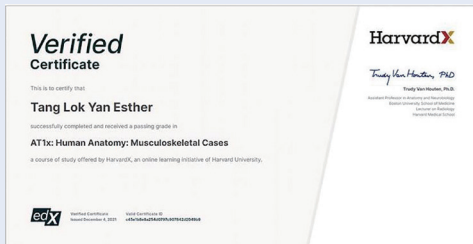

Fun Science Experiments!

Creative fun day, one of the school's activities that let primary school students to know more about our school and learn new knowledge by doing the activities. I was thrilled when I knew I got to volunteer for doing science experiments with the primary school students. It was definitely memorable experience to work with them in the Chemistry lab.

At the beginning, we conducted an experiment which proves that sulphuric acid can remove water molecules by writing words on a paper using sulphuric acid. We all had fun and some trouble on the way, the word that we wrote on the paper kept on spreading out on the paper. it was quite hard to get the words in shape but we still succeed in the end.

Then we did another experiment which was about natural indicator. We were given a few

test tubes filled with either acids or alkalis. We used one of the natural indicators, red cabbage to test whether the liquid in the test tubes are acids or alkalis. We also use the universal indicator to compare with the natural indicator. It turns out that it has a different slightly different colour than the natural indicators. The primary school students and I discussed about the results and made great teamwork with them.

Despite the pandemic getting better nowadays, we still need to wear a mask and follow the rules of social distancing, we still had an unforgettable day with the primary school students. Through volunteering for creative fun day, not only we improve to communicate with youngsters and get to get along with them but also got to learn more knowledge in science.
